

KEY to INDEX of FOLLIES Magazines 1-119

This Index was originally prepared and edited by Pieter and Rita Boogaart, and covered all issues up to number 82, and was in three parts. In 2022 Alan Terrill took it over and amalgamated the three parts into one, and then continued indexing the later issues using the same methodology devised by the Boogaarts.

The index will continue to be updated on the website, and can be searched online.

The names are those that the original authors used in their contributions, but some might use different words for the same building, so a tall battlemented structure made by a Mr John, might be called a Prospect Tower, Belvedere, just plain Tower or even Mr John's Folly.

The appearance of a name in the index doesn't imply that the building is a folly, or that it still exists, it simply means someone has mentioned it in an article.

The previous system of codes for counties has been discontinued and counties are now shown in full (if known).

Titles of Articles are in Bold.

AUTHORS OF ARTICLES ARE IN SMALL CAPS. (where they are simply mentioned in an article, their names are in lower case)

Book titles are in italics

Page references are by magazine number, semi-colon, page numbers. Page reference numbers for illustrations (with or without relevant text) are also in *italics*.

Eg So 45;4-7, *10* means the building is in issue 45 on pages 4 to 7 but there's a photo of it on page 10.

Articles which appeared in the journals are prefixed with a J, so J3;22 refers to an article on page 22 of Journal no 3.
